The focus of the course will be on applying the method and examination techniques.

M_o_R[®] Practitioner Course

A 5 day course aimed primarily at managers with responsibility for risk, but of great value in many other roles, such as:-

Delegates will gain a thorough grounding in the **M_o_R** method, and will apply the method to a given scenario, to ensure that they are able to use the method in practical situations.

The course includes both the Foundation and Practitioner examinations. The Foundation examination is a 1 hour multiple choice test. The Practitioner examination is a 3 hour open-book examination leading to the internationally recognised **M_o_R** Registered Practitioner qualification.
